Conservation Land Stewardship (CLS) was contracted by the Peggy Notebaert Nature Museum in Chicago, Illinois to implement native landscape concepts as developed within the master plan by Conservation Design Forum in 2003. The first phase of implementation included the creation of a native prairie garden and significant enhancement of the existing restored landscape. CLS staff members continue to work with museum staff to develop long term landscape management guidelines for the museum campus

CLS began site work at the Nature Museum campus in spring of 2004. Restoration efforts on this site are ongoing, and to date include:

- initial seeding of mesic prairie garden
- native plant installation within the mesic prairie garden and restored prairie landscapes
- planting media installation on the rainwater recirculation bluff wall
- rehabilitation and maintenance of interpretive trail systems
- site stewardship, monitoring, and invasive species control throughout restored communities and prairie gardens
